Hurricane Relief

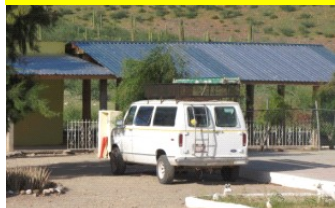

Cultural Trip

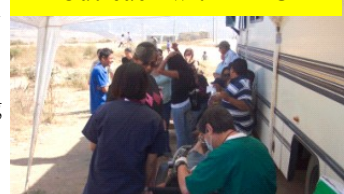
