At the end of the first day of children's ministry in Guaymas the Pastor came to me and said, "You need to take this lady home and will need a couple of men to help. I asked, 'Where does she live?'" Three of us lifted her out of the wheelchair and into the van. After driving around the hill we were told to turn on to a gravel/dirt street. We got the lady out of the van into the wheelchair, which was easier then loading, and started up the path. They had said, this house, so we started toward the first house. No, No, just a little more. So we continued up the hill to the next house, No, No, just a little more! *Do not get ahead of the story.* We passed several houses and carried her all the way to the top of the hill and the last house. The next 4 days we would go pick her up and take her home at the end of the program.

She had her leg amputated in February and lives with her daughter who is a drug dealer. It just makes you want to cry just thinking about this makes my eyes sweat. The most exciting part is she has a future home in heaven where these problems will be long forgotten and life will be so good with God. WOW, I have to go wash my face before someone sees me.

La Paz

MDU
